As the main producer of waste and CO₂, the construction industry plays a key role in climate protection. The growing awareness has manifested itself in the popular term "Bauwende", which goes hand in hand with a return to regionally available and recyclable building materials. In view of the enormous consumption of resources and the consequences for the climate and the environment, it is about time to rethink and re-evaluate traditional, natural materials.

In this context, the locally available material loam is experiencing a boom both in new construction and in the renovation of existing buildings and additionally offers the ideal conditions for climate-adapted and circular construction.

- What can we learn from traditional construction techniques?
 - How can circular economy and urban mining be realised?
- How can we build climate-friendly and sustainably in the future?
